

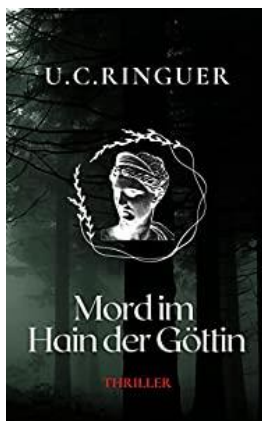
## “Professor Cariello and Colonel Camarata” series

A city has been lying buried under the lava of Vesuvius for 2000 years: it is Herculaneum, where an ancient villa has yet to be unearthed. However, it is not just any villa, but the Villa of the Papyri, which once housed the world's most famous library. A scientist is found cruelly murdered in one of its tufa tunnels. Was he searching for a mysterious object said to be hidden in the ruins of antiquity?

Colonel Camarata and Professor Cariello start to investigate the death of the scientist and the discovery of a strange manuscript. Their investigations lead to the finding of the body of the Queen of Judea, Berenice, mistress of the emperor Titus, and a second library of papyri.

In this second book of the series, a thrilling hunt for the killer and for the truth takes place in an enchanted valley. Surrounded by oak and cypress trees, Lake Nemi, long considered a place of ghosts and myths, provides the background for this gripping thriller based on true events.

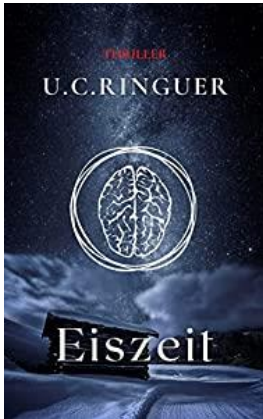
***Der Gottesbeweis (The evidence of God)***

Several people are interested in finding the stone, when a monk is found murdered... The professor is not indifferent to his death and finds himself on the trail of the Philosopher's Stone that was in the crown of the Hohenstaufen dynasty. But whose skeleton is found in the tomb of Frederick II?

A gripping hunt for the killer and the mystery of the glacier corpse begins, leading to a surprising discovery: perhaps Neanderthals died due to a magnetic pole reversal, and a similar reversal is about to happen again...

Cariello and Camarata follow the child's trail to a mysterious tunnel dug into a cratered hill near the remains of the villas of Roman emperors. And they soon find themselves on the trail of ancient rites and mysteries that also involve Orphism and the figures of Caesar and Augustus.
