Phoenix the squirrel is used to being "the pick of the litter... the biggest of the bunch, with the most lustrous fur." But after being snatched by a red-tailed hawk, haughty Phoenix finds himself battered and furless in Manhattan, far from his forest home Seidler (*Firstborn*) convincingly portrays rodent-human parallels; the rats' diverse community is passionately united as they fight to save their home, sabotaging electrical grids to raise awareness and sending strongly worded letters (written by Beckett) to voice their dissent. Soft black-and-white spot illustrations by Evans (the Little Paws series) add further charm to this animal adventure with direct social commentary.

The designation "firstborn" applies to several characters in Seidler's animal adventure—the effervescent narrator, Maggie the magpie; Blue Boy, a wolf who accepts Maggie as an unofficial pack member; and Lamar, Blue Boy's eldest son, who wrestleswho wrestles with familial duties and his unorthodox love for a coyote... Themes of self-acceptance, devotion, and integrity resonate as Maggie and others act on wisdom she learns from her first friend, Jackson the crow: "you can't be loyal to others if you're not loyal to your own nature first." A moving acknowledgement of true friendship provides a heartwarming conclusion to this absorbing tale. Ages 9–14.


