




I DO NOT EAT CHILDREN




I LIVED INSIDE A WHALE





Popo, who doesn't speak any English, is always there for Meimei whenever she needs an extra hand. They speak Mandarin at home, and Meimei picks up new words every day.








PEOPLE ARE MY FAVORITE PLACES





Abuela recognizes echoes of her own immigration journey and she gently guides Gloriana towards confidence. This beautifully painted, imaginative picture book celebrates the magic of existing in-between, and the transformative power of self-soothing to build confidence.


MAMLE WOLO



Whether it's his easily annoyed parents or prickly pedestrians on the street, K gets on everyone's bad side...and he didn't even do anything wrong!




Easier said than done.







Noor Khan doesn't want to start the last quarter of her senior year in a brand-new school in the middle of nowhere her mother dragged her and her little sister, Amal, off to after Noor's dad abruptly walked out of their lives. Now Noor has to figure out how to help her mom and sister, while making it through two months at this school until she's off to college.

But things don't go according to plan. While skipping class, she notices the librarian pulling books off the shelves and boxing them, in accordance with a new regulation that requires a book be removed from circulation, pending review, if even a single parent finds it objectionable. 
Can Noor effect change by speaking up against this censorship, navigating the tricky politics of the town, and can she trust the son of the school board president who she finds herself falling for?





Ronni Davis lives in Chicago, where she copyedits everything from TV commercials to billboards by day, and writes contemporary teen novels about brown girls falling in love by night.



With each stitch, the dark cloud around her lightens, until her big fears begin to feel less scary. As she heals tears in the fabric, she begins to find a sense of calm and hope.

This deeply resonant picture book explores the transformative power of creative expression. Children and parents alike will take away an appreciation for this beautiful artistic tradition, and for the great potential creative practices have to help us cope with difficult emotions.



Andrew recognizes that being a kid is hard and he writes to create ways for kids to see themselves in stories and characters, to accept and overcome their insecurities, or to escape for just a little while through the power of their imaginations.
