





Ready-to-Read Graphics books give readers the perfect introduction to the graphic novel format with easy-to-follow panels, speech bubbles with accessible vocabulary, and sequential storytelling that is spot-on for beginning readers. 
### WHEN THE FOG ROLLS IN





Sharing all the mysterious joys that nature's waters can bring to a child just learning to swim, like ocean sandpipers, tannin-soaked lakes, and the feeling of a waterfall on one's shoulders, Jack Won's brilliant illustrated text invites children to see the great big world that is opened WHEN YOU CAN SWIM.

Jack Wong (黃雋香) was born in Hong Kong and raised in Vancouver. In 2010, he left behind a life as a bridge engineer to pursue his Bachelor of Fine Arts at NSCAD University (Halifax, Canada), where he now lives with his wife and two cats.



A self-declared actual Jack-of-all-trades, he has also tried his hand at bookkeeping, teaching art, managing a psychology research lab, and running his own bicycle repair shop, just to name a few—a real education for creating children's books, if you ask him!

The books that Jack writes and illustrates are indelibly marked by a first-generation Asian Canadian experience, transposed upon the small-city living, natural beauty, and deeply rooted storytelling traditions of the Maritime east coast.

He seeks to share all of this with young readers, so that they may embrace the unique amalgams of experiences that make up their own lives.



Jack is the recipient of 12x12 Picture Book Challenge's 2021 Diversity Scholarship, competitive mentorships from Annick Press and Visual Arts Nova Scotia (with artist Steve Higgins), and a longlist mention in the 2020 CANSCAIP Writing for Children Competition. He volunteers in the Virtual Readers and Refugees Program hosted by the International Board on Books for Young People, and is an active member of SCBWI, Visual Arts Nova Scotia, and Writers' Federation of Nova Scotia.

Though the true story of these stones was not fully recovered, the power of the Mahu still calls out to those who pass by them at Waikiki Beach today.



Hinaleimoana Wong-Kalu is an award-winning Native Hawaiian teacher, cultural practitioner and filmmaker who uses digital media to protect and perpetuate indigenous languages and traditions. She was an advisor for the award-winning films Kumu Hina and A Place in the Middle, and received a National Education Association Human Rights Award, Native Hawaiian Educator of the year and White House Champion of Change Award for the groundbreaking impact campaigns associated with those films. Hina produced the PBS/ARTE feature documentary Leitis in Waiting and award-winning short "Lady Eva" about her transgender sisters in the Kingdom of Tonga. Hina is also a transgender health advocate, burial council chair, and composer of "Ku Haaheo E Kuu Hawaii," the internationally-known anthem for the protection of Mauna Kea which was honored as Hawaiian Song of the Year in the 2020 Na Hoku Hanohano Awards, known as the Hawaiian Grammys.

Dean Hamer and Joe Wilson are Emmy Award-winning filmmakers. Dean is also a New York Times Book of the Year author. Daniel Sousa is an Academy Award-nominated animator who uses the themes embedded in myths and legends to examine archetypes of human nature. Born in Cape Verde, Sousa's short films include Feral, which was supported by a Creative Capital Foundation grant and screened at Sundance, and Fable, which won awards at festivals around the world. He recently completed animating several native legends for the four-part PBS special Native America, which weaves history and science with living indigenous traditions. Sousa has taught at the Rhode Island School of Design, Harvard University, The Museum School, The Art Institute of Boston and the Animation Workshop in Denmark.
