





#### A plunge into the depths of a summer's day



Arno Frank's second novel is about the desire to break free and the longing to arrive, about the hidden consequences of our decisions and about the places we never forget. A book as radiant as the last day of summer.

It's hot. And half the town is at the open-air swimming pool. Kiontke the lifeguard is there, still standing on the poolside, even though nobody had thought he would be able to carry on after the accident. Renate is there, sitting behind the till and smoking too much, with a soft spot for Kiontke which she will never admit to. Joe, for her part, is trying to swim against the current of the many missed opportunities in her life. Lennart has been swept back to the events that determined his later path in life. Isobel is there - she knew the outdoor pool before it even existed - and the two siblings who want to do a sailor dive, first from the three-metre diving board, then from five metres, and finally from seven metres. But the seven-metre diving board is off-limits, it has been for years, ever since the accident that hangs like a distant roll of thunder over this shimmering summer's day.

Vienna, July 31, 1914: In frenetic excitement, the inhabitants of the capital of the Austro-Hungarian empire await the expiration of the German ultimatum. Thirty-six hours to go. The city is a raging torrent; the war enthusiasm of the young generation pervades every last corner of Vienna.

In the middle of this war frenzy, Hans, an inquisitive and bright farmhand from Tyrol, arrives in the capital to see the famous psychoanalyst and dream interpreter Helene Cheresch. Once there, he meets Adam, a musically gifted aristocrat, whose prestigious family has, however, already chosen a military career for him. The unequal trio is completed by Klara, one of the first women to earn a doctorate in mathematics at the University of Vienna, supported by the suffragettes as well as by her opportunistic lover who is no one less than Helene Cheresch. The three young people are worlds apart - divided by social classes, and shaped by gender roles that they do not fit in - but all three are facing the collapse of the world as they know it. Together, Hans, Adam and Klara spend the last night before mobilization in the vibrant city that increasingly threatens to elude their grasp. Their paths will lead them underground, into a whole new world beneath the actual city, where they embark on morphineinduced dream journeys, and participate in a séance in the city's canal system until they finally unmask Helene as an ingenious puppet master who manipulates her patients including the three protagonists.




Stine is born in the GDR and grows up in reunified Germany. She is just three years old when the Wall comes down. But her family are deeply wedded to a system they cannot move on from, and to the belief that they have lived the 'right' life. In this wonderfully intelligent and clear-eyed book, Anne Rabe tells the story of a generation whose origins are an empty space.

Stine is born in the mid-1980s in a small town on the East German Baltic coast, a child of reunification. She is too young to understand the change of system in the GDR, but her family's complex ideological views have an impact on the next generation. As her relatives hide the lost world behind an impenetrable silence, Stine finds herself asking questions she can no longer repress. Anne Rabe has written a clear-sighted and unsettling book with great literary power - a mixture of non-fiction and literature, knowledgeably researched and at the same time captivatingly beautiful. She traces the wounds of a generation that grew up between dictatorship and democracy, and explores the origins of racism and violence.

A typewritten manuscript found in an attic in Brazil reveals an astonishing and shockingly far-sighted novel written in exile in the 1930s.

Germany, in the 1930s: The disenfranchisement of Jews living in Germany is already widespread. 



## In Thirteenoaks, the clocks literally tell a different time...

Momme Bang is terrified of the number 13. And then he finds himself, of all places, in a secret "13th district" of Berlin, in a strange time period where all the achievements of modernity have been rejected. But behind the traditionalist facade of this Berlin district that is so bizarrely frozen in time, a power struggle is raging, and Momme finds himself at the centre of a conspiracy...

An abandoned guest house is his last chance: fleeing his own pathological compulsions, Momme moves into the building as a house sitter. He cannot escape his fear of the number 13, however: Momme discovers a 13th room which supposedly does not exist. The house also seems to be haunted by the ghost of a white woman. His search for the woman takes Momme to a secret district of Berlin, which is the opposite of the modern metropolis: electricity is forbidden here, and the people have embraced the return to an eternal truth instead of progress. But Momme's intrusion into this community disrupts the balance of relationships within it. Colonel Secundus Falke, for example, who is investigating the Bang case, is playing a double game, as is a certain Hinckledey, who commands the radical "Legion of Saint Uriel". And the fate of the man who has smuggled Momme in seems to be closely connected to the resistance of an organisation called "The Sisters". Soon, it's a matter of life and death.

## The diversity of species on our Earth is under threat

In this vivid and accessible book, Katrin Böhning-Gaese, one of the world's leading ecologists, and science journalist Friederike Bauer reveal the importance of biodiversity to our own survival. A highly topical sociopolitical plea for a new understanding of nature, with practical suggestions as to how we can preserve biodiversity for present and future generations.

Pandemics, climate change and the disappearance of biodiversity are all linked, and they accelerate one another. But whilst we have seen the world engage with the pandemic, and a global movement has developed around the issue of climate change, the same cannot be said for biodiversity. 

## Backlash is here: How gender equality triggers new violence against women

US Supreme Court rules against abortions, significant rise in domestic violence noticed by police, deathly violence phantasies against women trending on TikTok. A reactionary countermovement is attacking the rights of women that we took for granted in Western democracies - scientist and political journalist Susanne Kaiser sheds light on this highly contemporary issue and drafts possible solutions.

- The front door is covered with locks and bolts. It would take minutes to open them all. Mrs. F. knows this. The fixtures were installed by her husband, so she won't try to escape again. She's a lawyer, he's a respected judge.

Susanne Kaiser's book transfers Susan Faludi's theory of the 1980s about a backlash against feminist gains into today's digital age. For over ten years she has researched about this phenomenon. In her book, she combines the interviews she conducted with women whose lives were affected by patriarchal violence with the analysis of societal, political and private aspects of what it means to be a woman today. This holistic approach shows with shocking clarity the still existing and urgent need for change. And: it presents us with possible ways to make that change happen.



## A surprisingly topical, different history of modernity

Especially now, that 'gender-fluidity', 'pansexuality' and 'non-binary' are on everyone's lips, opera is more in vogue than it has been for a long time.

From the Queen of the Night to Lulu: Ingenious and original, opera breaks every gender corset. Like no other genre –except fashion, opera is given the ability to de-naturalize gender roles.
